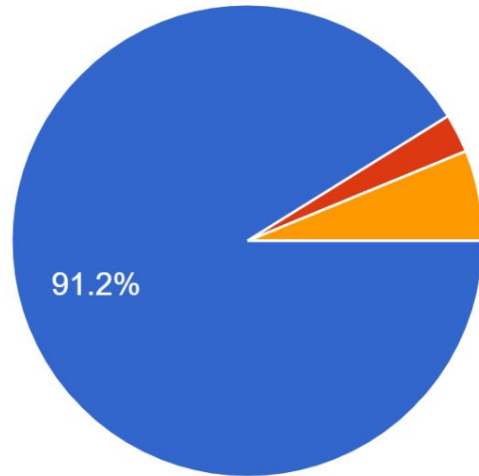

My child is happy at Damers

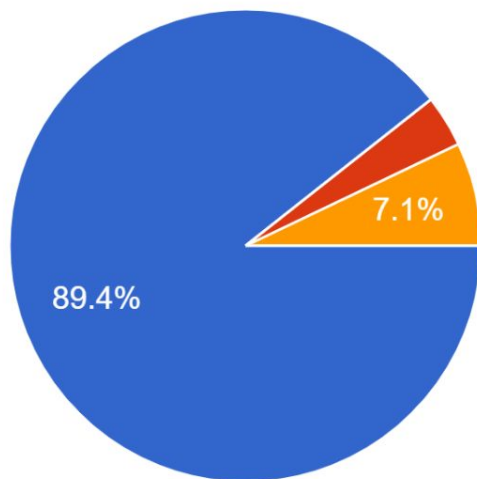

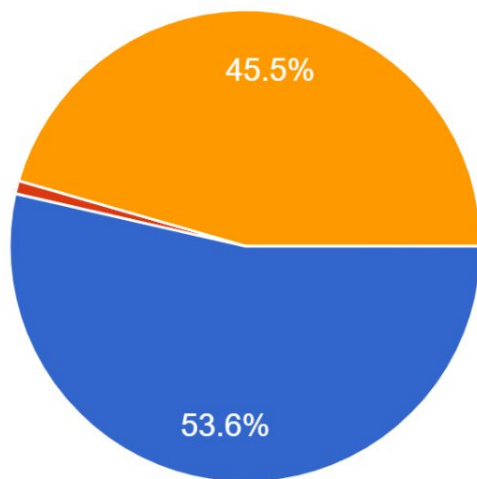

There are high expectations of good behaviour at school

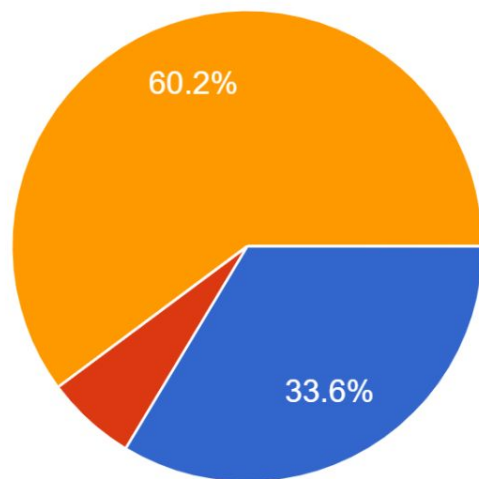

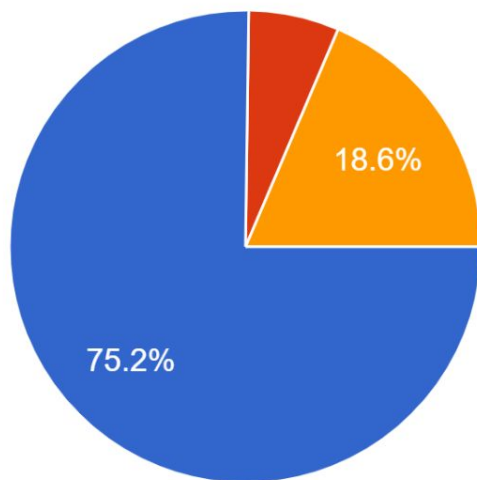

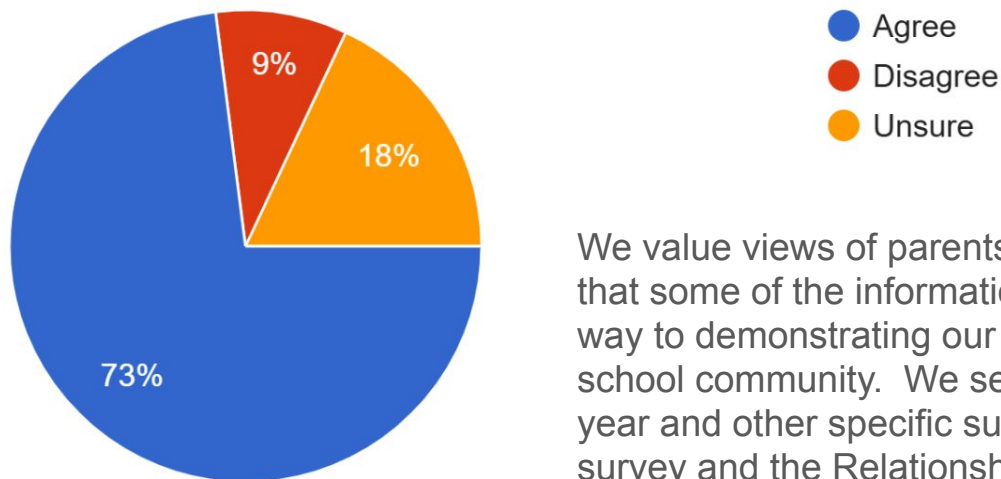
