

Sentence

A group of words that are put together to mean something.

Singular

Singular forms refer to one thing (noun).

E.g. cat
church
child
tooth

Plural

Plural forms refer to more than one noun. Plurals are usually marked by the addition of -s, -es.

E.g. cats, churches

Some nouns are mass nouns and don't change in the plural.

E.g. teeth, feet, sheep.

Suffix

A group of letters added to the end of a word to change its grammatical use.

E.g. call - called
teach - teacher
green - greenish

year 1 Grammar

Prefix

A group of letters added to the start of a word to change its grammatical use.

E.g. dismiss
untidy
inedible

Full stop

Used at the end of a sentence

E.g. The sun was shining today.

Capital letter

Used at the beginning of a sentence and when writing the names of people or places.

E.g. She waved at Sarah.
