
repetition to help them remember. They have made story maps and become story telling professionals ready to take to the stage.

What you need (Equipment):

- * Blindfold (scarf)
- Your hand
- Equal size pieces of apple, potato and onion (adult to cut it up)
- An assistant

How to (Method):

Ensure you are not allergic to any of the food items

- Place the blindfold over your eyes and hold your nose with your hand
- Have your assistant place one item into your mouth at a time, and try to guess what it is based only on how it tastes

Extension - try the same investigation with other foods.

What's happening (The Science bit)?

Your sense of smell is a major factor in how food items taste. When your nose is plugged or blocked you lose your normal ability to taste. Aside from the textures, you probably couldn't detect a difference between the items you tried. When you let go of your nose your nose, all the flavours should come back, although the strongest ones might overwhelm the
