final farewell to our dear friend and colleague, Tim Oram next Monday.


We look forward to celebrating Tim's life and to remembering the difference that his unique humour, creativity, warmth and kindness made to the lives of many children, families and colleagues. We will

Celebrating Spring

Learning About Animals

In Year 2 we are continuing to learn about the polar regions and will be extending that to learn about polar exploration this term. We have also been continuing to learn about Emperor penguins - we are now such experts that we are preparing to publish our own non chronological reports. We have been writing our introductions and subheadings in readiness for this.

We have also been exploring adaptation in the animal world and the beauty of nature through our artwork. Year 2 have enjoyed looking at symmetry in the natural world with a particular focus on the magnificent tiger. Using our observation skills we have created our own pieces using both pencil and pastel.





Super Spotters

Some of the Damers Nature Club children had the opportunity to plant the first plants and sow the first seeds in the Damers wildflower meadow, which is just a few minutes from the school, at the top of Duke's Parade, in an area called The Swale.

The children helped plant Lady's Bedstraw, which was collected by Damers children on Midsummer's



day in 2021, from the Weymouth Avenue cemetery. Miles King from People Need Nature also gave the children seed heads from Bee Orchids that had flowered last year on Fire Station Green; and the downy seeds from the Picnic Thistle, collected from nearby Poundbury Hillfort. The Children enjoyed breaking open the Bee

Orchid seed heads and finding the dust-like seed within. It will take at least six years before the seed becomes a flowering orchid! The thistle seeds were launched into the air and some will fall and germinate in the meadow while others will fly much further.

There will be other opportunities to go on seed collecting expeditions this Spring and the children will have the opportunity to grow wildflowers from the seed they collected, before planting out the flowers in the Damers Meadow.

The children sang a variety of songs from folk to Ed Sheeran and our own school song, We Go Together, from the film


Grease. As if that wasn't enough we added some great dance moves. Well done everybody. We hope you enjoyed it because we certainly enjoyed watching you.

 Measuring things that grow and change in size, like plants, is not only fun, but it's full of opportunities for maths learning at all levels. Look for bulbs that are starting to grow and measure the



shoots - daffodils and other shooting flowers whose bright green spears are easy to measure as they grow. What size is the tallest shoot you can find?

• The backs of seed packets also estimate how long it will take for each plant to mature - mark off when each plant should be ready based on these estimations and practise using the calendar to countdown to harvest time!

Jane Goodall Roots and Shoots Awards

Two members of Damers Eco Crew represented Damers First School at Jane Goodall Roots and Shoots Awards at The Barbican in London on Friday. The Jane Goodall Roots and Shoots Programme has been running for over 30 years. These were the first awards since March 2019 when Damers First School won the prestigious Environment Education Award. The children got the opportunity to speak with Dame Jane Goodall about all the environment projects they had been leading that included reducing the school energy costs using Energy



Sparks, campaigning for a safe cycle route from Dorchester town to Poundbury and a top secret item for the Nature Area and Pond which they hope to launch once funding has been raised.

The day ended with Jane speaking to a theatre of children about the hope she has for the future of our environment. Damers First School children handed over the trophy to winners Goat Lees Primary School, Ashford, Kent.
