This half term ...

Life Cycles

This half term Foundation have been exploring what lives outside our classroom. This has involved some hands-on work looking at both plants and animals. We have visited the pond and wildlife area where we were lucky enough to spot two stages of a life cycle: a frog and lots of big tadpoles. Again at the chicken coop we got hands on and the hens appreciated all the

Super Spotters

Our Year 4s had a magical time at Leeson House spotting orchids, skylarks, deer, rabbits and even finding a robin who flew into one of the boys bedrooms! Whilst pond dipping there we found lots of amazing newts. Did you know that there are three species of newt native to the UK, and we found all of them at Leeson House. Here are some ways to help you identify the different types of newt

Smooth Newt

Look for the pale spotted throat.



- Size: Grows to around 10-11cm in length.
- Colour: Males brown/olive; females light brown. Belly is usually yellowy orange with black spots. The throat is pale with darker spots.
- Skin Texture: Smooth

Palmate Newt

Look for the pale throat without spots and a dark stripe through the eye



- Size: Grows to around 7-11cm; slightly smaller than the smooth newt.
- Colour: Males olive brown; females yellowish brown. The throat is white/pale pink and does not have spots or speckling. The eye has a dark stripe running horizontally through it.
- Skin Texture: Smooth

Great Crested Newt

Much larger than the smooth or palmate newt, the male has a large



crest which is broken where the tail meets the body.

• Size: Up to 15cm in length. Females may be even larger than this.

 Colour: Dark brown or black with white/ silver dots on sides. Underside is orange with black spots.
 Pale throat.

Skin Texture: Warty


School Uniform for September

Please ensure you allow plenty of time for the delivery of school uniform orders with SchoolTrends over summer, ideally place your order by the end of June.


