In music this term in Year 2 we have been learning about the piece Carnival of the Animals. We have loved guessing the different animals, moving like each animal in time with the music, creating our own artwork and even composing our own musical descriptions of animals on classroom instruments. We made our own Victorian herbal remedies using herbs from our school garden, compared the lives of Florence Seacole and Mary Seacole and reflected on how they each embodied many of our Damers school values.







## Super Spotters

Brrrr it's cold outside! We've been thinking about the Damers Value of the Month which is love and how we can show this by helping the wildlife over the chilly winter months. The bird hide area has a new fence to help protect the small saplings and woodland bulbs. We've noticed that lots more small birds have been visiting the bird feeders so our fence is also providing shelter and is a super place for our resident robin to sing to us. We have put up bug boxes filled with foraged twigs and leaves creating cosy spaces for our insect friends to spend winter.

Here are five ways you can help wildlife over winter:

- Let your garden go wild. Leave piles of leaves that animals can hide, rest and hibernate in.
- Break the ice. If you have a pond make sure there is a hole in the ice so that toxic gases don't build up. Always make sure an adult does this job as ponds can be dangerous places especially when frozen.
- Feed the birds. Provide a range of seeds, fresh unsalted peanuts and table scraps (cheese and fruits such as apples and pears.) Garden birds also love dried mealworms or waxworms, which can be bought from bird food suppliers.
- Provide fresh water. When the temperatures drop below zero, finding clean fresh water to drink can be difficult for wildlife. You can help by leaving some out for them. It is best to provide fresh water each night in a shallow bowl. Don't add anything to stop the water freezing, and change the water every day to ensure it's fresh.
- Attract visitors with good food. When food is scarce, putting out a small amount of an appropriate treat will help to see the mammals visiting your garden through the winter.

#### **Butterfly Totem Pole**

Damers First School have unveiled an amazing butterfly totem pole in their school grounds overlooking the Great Field on Poundbury.

The wooden, carved butterfly totem pole came about through an art exhibition the school took part in with Poundbury Arts organised by Judy Tate. The exhibition was called It's up to Us, after a book with the same name by Christopher Lloyd, forwarded by King Charles. Each year group focused on a different artist from the book. Year 3 made a wonderful ceramic totem pole (inside our school) with a ceramic artist and we wanted another totem pole to go with this for our outside area. We came across Victor Krause's impressive wood carving work at the Poundbury Arts Exhibition and we thought we had to have Victor working with the children on the totem pole.

Victor worked with teacher Nikki Simmonds and Year 4 children to design the totem pole. Having butterflies was really important to the children as they are part of the Damers school logo and also our strand names. They are also part of a natural cycle that keeps on going. The totem pole symbolises small butterflies flying up around

the pole to become bigger butterflies flying off to their next destination. Victor has done an amazing job carving and putting the totem pole together. We are very grateful for the time he spent sharing his expertise with the children.

The project wouldn't have been possible without the donation of the cedar tree from AG Tree Services' Alan Goldstone and the funding support from Patricia Fay Memorial Fund through The Arts Society Dorset Branch, who worked tirelessly to fill out the grant forms. Also, a huge thank you to CG Fry and Sons and Jason Hockey who had the challenge of getting the totem pole into the school grounds and standing it up right!



#### The 5 Rs

Charlie from Learn Play Nexus came to film Damers Eco Crew about the importance of the 5Rs - Rethink, Reduce, Reuse, Refil, Recycle - and to hear what they thought about the U-Fill Gluestick (the world's only refillable gluestick). The film will help to launch the U-Fill Refill empties sack across the UK where all the refill gluestick empty containers will be placed in the paper sack. The sack, once full will then get collected by a courier and sent back to the Learn Play Nexus HQ to be refilled with glue and reused.



### Copper Base News

We have been enjoying books about the snow as we start to think about Christmas time. We have been writing instructions for building a snowman and making snowman families. The Copper Base children have been working together to sequence the stories, change the characters and write new endings. We have really enjoyed sharing these books in pairs and in small groups.

We welcomed Tracy into Year 4 from the Earth Energy Education team. She taught us lots about Solar Power and the importance of renewable energy. We enjoyed investigating
